#### Lead Us From Darkness

#### We Light the First Advent Candle

Today as we come to light the first candle on our Advent Star, we remember the presence of the Lord our God, who reveals Himself to His people. The presence of God elicits many responses when it is revealed, such as awe, terror and comfort. When Moses saw the burning bush he was curious at the sight. He was drawn to the bush and when he came near he heard the Lord say, "Take off your sandals, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." Moses was in awe of what he heard and saw and so he hid his face. Isaiah saw the glory of the Lord revealed and his response was one of woe. "I am a man of unclean lips," Isaiah cried, "and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts." But when the Lord revealed Himself to the servant of Elisha, there was comfort. "O LORD," Elisha prayed, "please open his eyes that he may see." So the LORD opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw the angel army of God. The servant's fear dissolved with the knowledge of God's great presence. The psalmist, in the 118th Psalm, longs for the presence of God. He recalls the steadfast love of the Lord that endures forever. He prays for the Lord's presence to be with him in the midst of his distress. He stirs himself with words of faith and declares, "The Lord is on my side; I will not fear. The Lord is on my side as a helper." At Advent we recall the presence of the Lord, when He came, not through fire, or glory, or armies, but as a babe in Bethlehem. And as we see Him through the eyes of faith we stand in awe, knowing that God has come to earth to be with us. We stand in terror knowing that in the beginning a manger holds the babe, but in the end a cross will hold His broken and bruised body. But above all we are comforted, knowing that Jesus is our helper; He is our strength and our song, and He has become our salvation. And so we sing, "Come, Lord Jesus..."


