Advent Liturgy

On this Fourth Sunday in Advent our liturgists are: The Tan family and the Zhang family (8:30 AM) and The Tyger family (11:00 AM).

Advent Litany (Responsive)

Leader: The Advent season is a time to remember the promises of God.

People: "Confirm to Your servant Your promise, that You may be feared."

Leader: A promise is a word given that assures the recipient that something will be done or

something will come to pass.

People: "Let Your steadfast love come to me, O LORD, Your salvation according to Your

promise; for I trust in Your word."

Leader: A promise is only secure insofar as the one who gives such a promise is trustworthy.

People: "Remember Your word to Your servant, in which You have made me hope. This is

my comfort in my affliction, that Your promise gives me life."

Leader: Because God is great and loving, He is trustworthy and His promises are certain.

People: "The LORD is my portion; I promise to keep Your words. I entreat Your favor with

all my heart; be gracious to me according to Your promise."

Leader: God's greatest promise was to send a redeemer who would save us from our sin.

People: "My soul longs for Your salvation; I hope in Your word. My eyes long for Your

promise; I ask, "When will You comfort me?"

Leader: This Advent season we look to God to fulfill all His promises, remembering that all the

promises of God find their "Yes" in Christ Jesus.

People: "Uphold me according to Your promise, that I may live, and let me not be put to

shame in my hope! Hold me up, that I may be safe and have regard for Your

statutes continually!"

Lead Us From Darkness

We Light the Fourth Advent Candle

Today as we come to light the fourth candle on our Advent Star, we remember the promises of God made to all mankind, made to the house of Israel and given to His covenant people. Long ago, in the Garden of Eden, God spoke a word of promise to His creation and to His image bearers, Adam and Eve. The promise was simple and clear, "Do not eat of the tree of the knowledge of Good and Evil, for if you eat of it, on that day you shall surely die." We mourn knowing that our parents in the flesh ate the fruit, and because God is trustworthy, He kept His promise and death entered into the world. But God made another promise, telling all of humanity that a child would come, born of the woman, who would defeat our great enemy, death. Many years passed as people waited on the promise, but it was not fulfilled. God reaffirmed that promise with David when He promised him that He would build David a dynasty, never lacking a man to sit upon his throne. Israel rejoiced and waited on the promises of God. Many years later it looked as though the promises would be broken. Israel found itself under siege by the Babylonians. Jerusalem was about to fall; the kingdom suffered on the edge of exile. How can the promises of God for life and a good future come to pass if the people are no more? Is God not trustworthy and true? Is He not a promise-keeping God? God always keeps His promises and that is why He tells the prophet Jeremiah to speak a word of hope. God says, "Behold, the days are coming when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and He shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness." God made a promise and He not only delivered Israel but He also delivered His covenant people by sending His Son. Jesus is the Righteous Branch, the righteousness of God who conquers death and sin, and delivers those who trust in Him. He came long ago and He promises to come again and that is why today we sing, "Come, Lord Jesus..."
