We know that His resurrection was confirmed by the testimony of His enemies, and by the resurrection of the dead, whose graves did open, and they did rise and appear to many within the city of Jerusalem. It was also confirmed by the testimony of His angels, and by the senses and judgment of His apostles and of others, who had conversation, and did eat and drink with Him after His resurrection.
